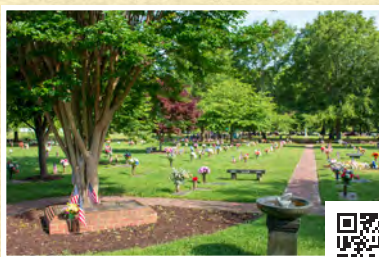


Your Community Cemetery
